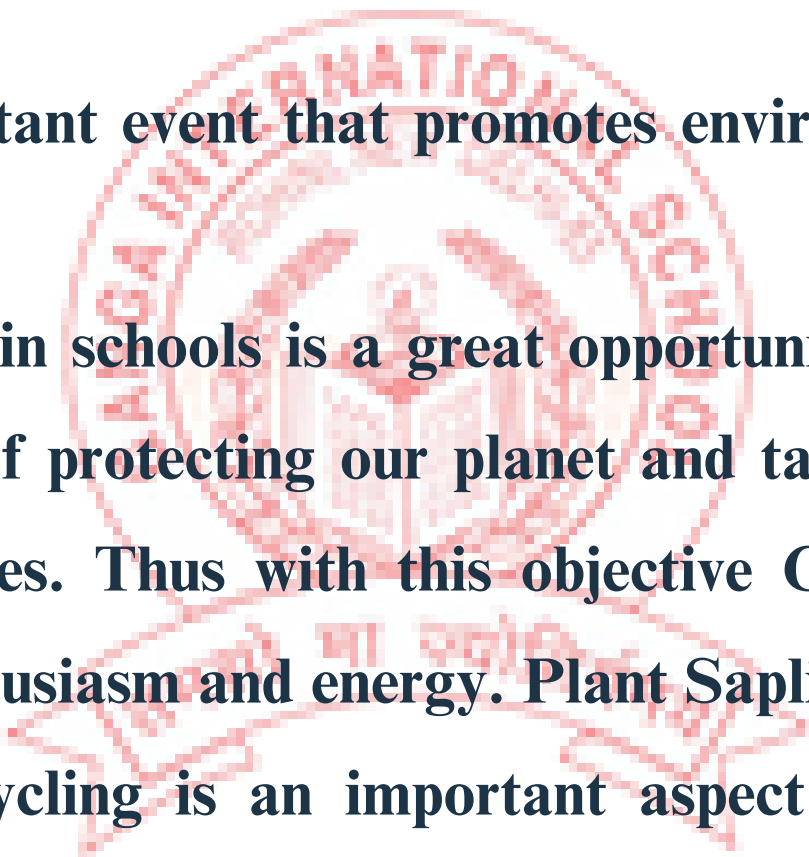


Earth Day

Important parenting tips were given by the Headmistress of the school. Parents played a very important role in making this event a successful one.



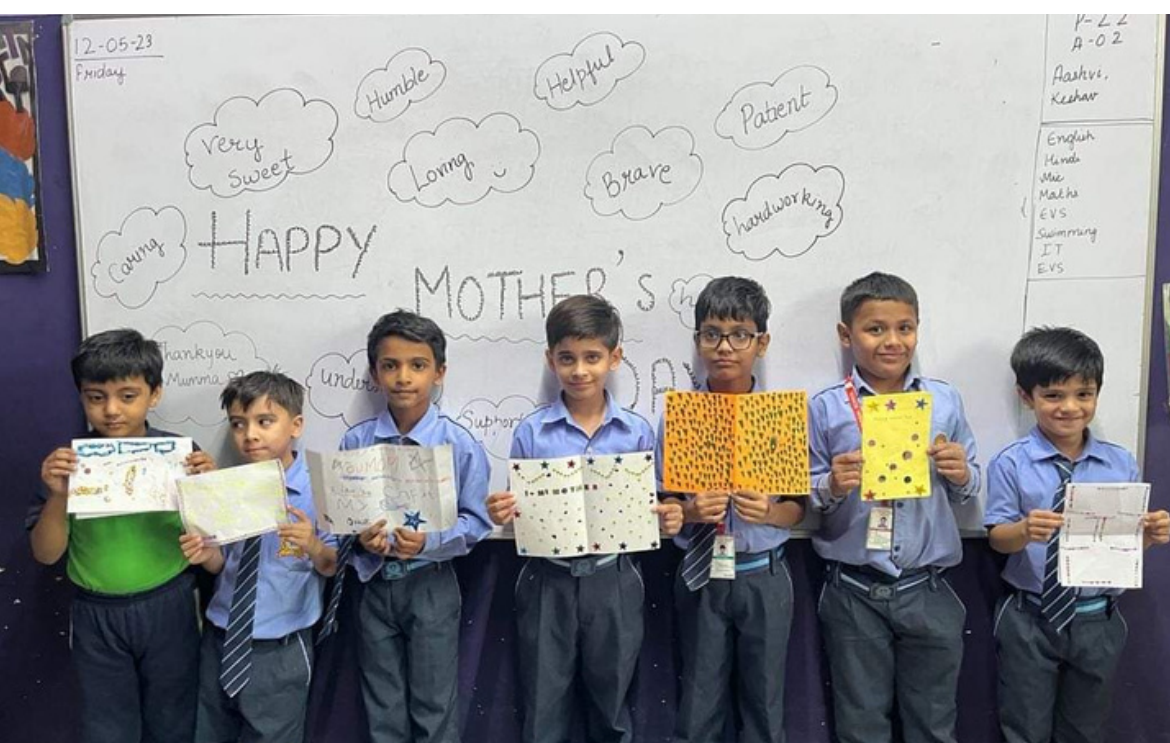
Mother's Day

Mother's Day was celebrated with a great fervor and zeal in the school campus.

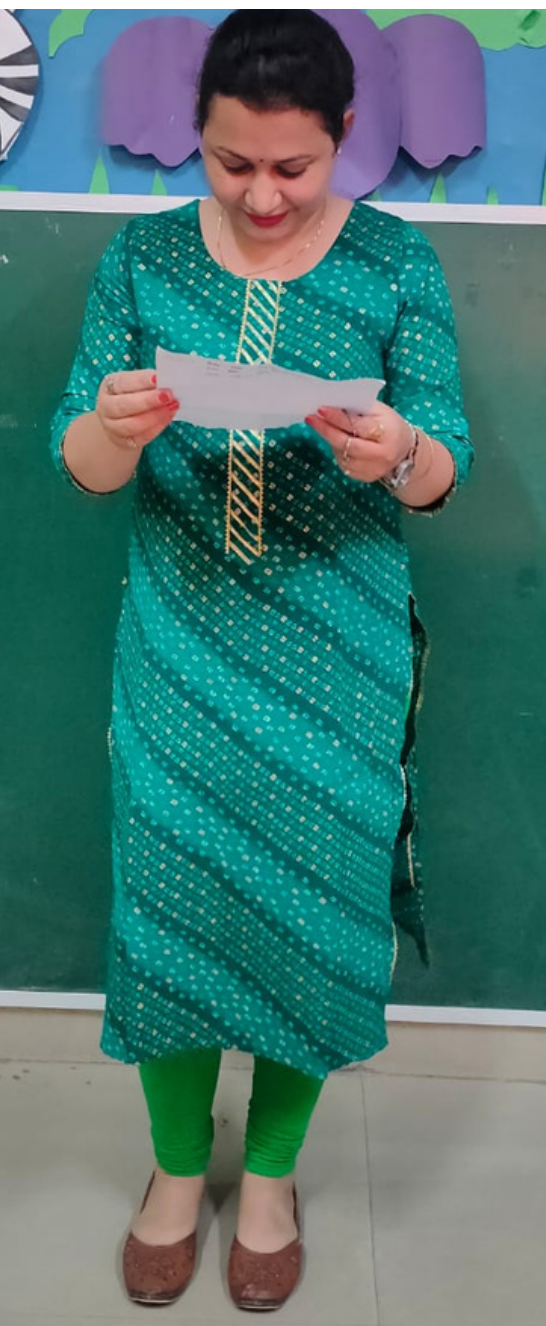
On this day children paid tribute to the most important person of their life.

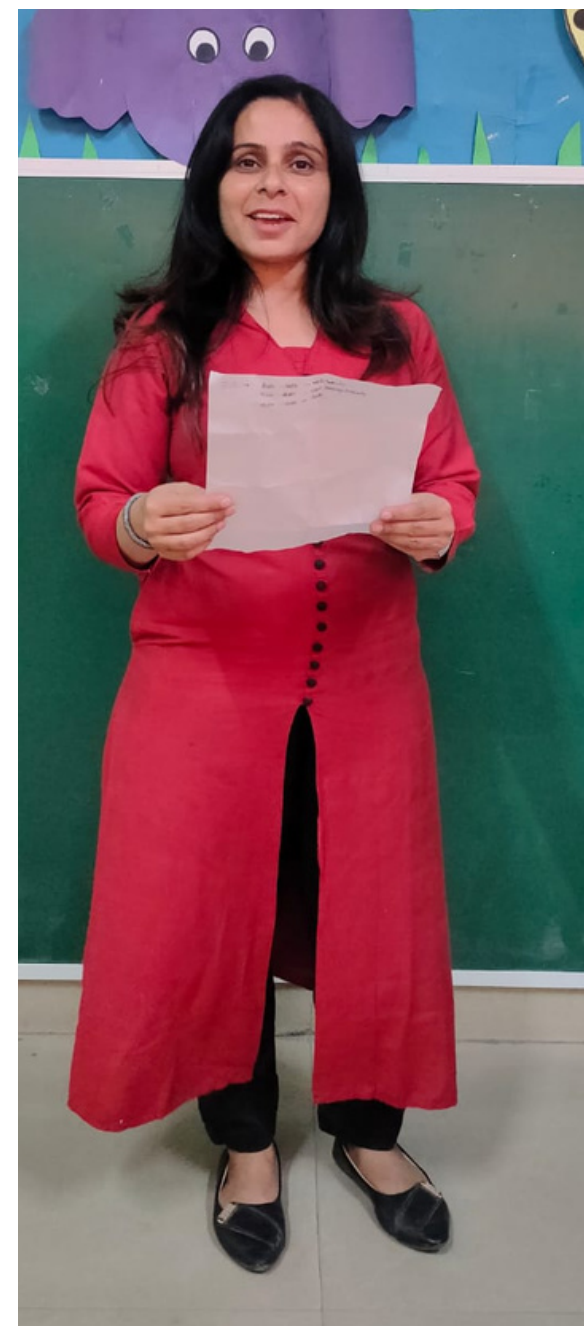
गंगा इंटरनेशनल स्कूल सावदा में कला समेकित अधिगम पर वर्कशाप का सफल आयोजन

From The Desk Of Headmistress

These days it has been observed that students depend very much on tutors and due to several distractions like the internet, T.V, handheld games, X-boxes, their learning process has become slow and they struggle in their studies. Whatever they learn is forgotten as soon as they finish their exams. To improve the learning process and to retain what has been learnt, independent learning is an important factor. Independent or self-directed learning is an important skill which a child should acquire to improve one's learning. What is independent learning? Independent learning is when a child becomes autonomous and is less dependent on teachers for their support in learning. In other words, a child is dependent on himself for finding facts and doing research work instead of relying on the teacher for supplying information. Independent learning prepares a student not just for education but for the life ahead. Once achieved, it will make students excel in their work areas. Independence in learning leads to motivation, independence, time management, multi-tasking, strong reading and writing skills. While undertaking self study a student should study with keen interest and full concentration, noticing all the new words and their spellings. First reading should be done speedily. Try reading alone and without taking support as long as possible. If research is required, try reading from different sources. Be persistent and keep on working. Taking support and advice is important, try to take one if it's necessary. Debates are also useful, debates with peers will lead a student to great ideas. Set goals for yourself. Manage to achieve your goal in set time. An independent learner will surge ahead in life and will always be successful.
